Priest in Charge

Dearly Beloved in Christ,

As I recently shared in church, we are so blessed to have this historic and sacred space in which to worship every week. As one worships here on Sunday mornings there is a felt presence of all the faithful souls who have sustained Christ Church Rock Spring Parish for over two centuries. Indeed, it is the people, those who love and follow Jesus, who make a church a living embodiment of the kingdom of God's love, forgiveness and welcome to all who seek a deeper experience of the holy in their lives. God in Christ calls us to be a community of welcome and hospitality for all who seek such an experience in their lives with others who love God and love their neighbors – all of us wayfarers in an often times challenging and complex world.

Since coming out of the more than two years of a world-wide pandemic, one senses new life unfolding in Rock Spring Parish. We discover new ways of being the presence of Christ for others, for instance, in our new-found care for creation. Inspired by the leadership of the Rock Spring Keepers, we are developing a deeper understanding of what it means to be stewards of God's creation in this place that has fostered faithfulness in following the call of Jesus to teach the Good News and become a healing and reconciling presence in God's world.

I recently attended a farewell reception for The Right Reverend Robert Ihloff as he retired for the second time as a bishop for the Diocese of Maryland. He made a point of telling me how much he enjoyed his visit with us last year. We had given him, among other gifts, a few bottles of water from the Rock Spring. He told me that he took one of those vials with him visiting a parish along the western shore who also has an environmental ministry and is restoring wetlands on their property that empty into the bay. Which wetlands are at the end of the Rock Spring. He told me how grateful they were to pour the pure water from the source of the Rock Spring to co-mingle with the waters they were working hard to restore. A small but symbolic gesture of the work we share to insure there are clean waters for future generations to share and to care for, made possible by our very own Rock Spring Keepers.

The Keepers once again call us all to collect film-plastics (shopping bags, wrappers, etc.) as a second round of keeping another 500 pounds of plastic out of the landfills. We successfully collected 500 pounds recently and were awarded the Trex-Bench that sits in the gardens near the entrance to the Parish Hall. Trex is an eco-friendly building material made from film plastic and reclaimed sawdust. Our goal is to collect another 500 pounds and get ourselves another bench to provide a place where someone may sit and enjoy the 12 acres that houses our parish home. Collection places are outside the Kitchen Door and inside the parish hall. Tell all your friends, relatives and neighbors to help us in collecting more film plastic that can be recycled into eco-friendly Trex! Think "Film-Plastic."

And also share with them the Good News that Sunday Worship in Christ Church is open and welcome to one and all at 9:45am Sunday morning throughout the year. We can all bring our film-plastic on Sunday mornings, worship together in church, and enjoy fellowship afterwards in the newly air-conditioned Parish Hall! How fortunate we are to have such a sacred and holy place to come together week by week, in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit and our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Join us for “It's All About Love,” a churchwide festival of worship, learning, community, and action for the Episcopal branch of the Jesus Movement, to be held Sunday, July 9 through Wednesday, July 12, at the Baltimore Convention Center.

“It's All About Love” features three Jesus Movement festival “tents” – Evangelism, Creation Care, and Racial Reconciliation. Each tent will offer an evening revival worship service and major plenary speaker, plus dozens of day-time workshops, panels, practice opportunities and other ways to engage. Stick with one tent or explore across the tents, following the themes of: worship and liturgy, formation, justice and advocacy, leadership, preaching, stewardship, and youth and children.

Christ Church Vestry Minutes

May 17, 2023

[Virtual Meeting Via Zoom]

Attendance: Fr. Kirk, Jane O’Leary, Leslie Amtmann, Janet Clifton, Peggy Reel, Lois Tidey, Lyn Edmunds

Meeting began at 7:00 pm with Celtic opening prayer by Fr. Kirk

Vestry minutes from 4/19/2023 meeting were approved as written.

Treasurer’s Report: Cash balance up owing to increased Edw.Jones Acc’t. Pledges are up with one new pledge and one increased pledge, bringing CC to 102% of targeted member giving. Yet, be mindful that so far we have withdrawn half of the TRP account that was approved for the year. Employee compensation 6% above projected, not alarming.

Other Positives: Hall rentals up due to Sr. Warden’s diligence in raising and collecting rents. To date, flower income is \$1000 ahead (large portion is for Christmas flowers, not yet expended). We are overall 10% above budget for income. On target with total operating expenses. Utilities appear to be 38% over budget at this point, compared to 191% over at this time last year. Early Indications suggest decrease in electric bills. We are on target with total operating expenses. We budgeted a \$10,000 deficit, but as of now, CC is 18% below target.

CCS: So far, 8 Vestry Gifts received, leaving \$8,350 balance due on \$11,000 debt. Outstanding pledges would add an additional \$590. Fr. Kirk outlined Phase II of campaign: a “first class” letter sent to congregation in June specifically requesting pledges/gifts to retire this debt.

Audit Committee: reports using audit checklist, the verification of accounting has been smooth so far, with no surprises. In process of clarifying how ECW and Cemetery handle expense approvals, in order to complete the audit.

Treasurer’s report was approved as presented.

Rector’s Report: Review of recent and forthcoming events:

Sheriff’s Memorial Event May 9th was very moving, a “powerful presence in our cemetery.” Strong connection between CC and community, as 1st officer killed in the line of duty is buried here. Thanks to Leslie’s smooth coordination of this event.

Wedding this weekend, and Memorial Day Observance on May 29 (cemetery).

Fr. Kirk attended Clergy conference: “Resurrection Through Relationship,” in which Clergy engaged in 1:1 listening and sharing to understand (e.g.) one another’s transformative experiences and interests, a process which could be extended to congregation and community. Useful process during times of rebirth and transition, such as at CC. Notes Claggett being renovated to improve conference and retreat possibilities.

Fr. Kirk notes since Easter, Sunday Live-Stream attendance is consistently 6-10 people; with 15-22 people in church. Hard to give meaningful and accurate figures in Parochial Report.

Cemetery: Leslie noted that without consulting the Cemetery Warden, someone “deep-cleaned” the stone memorial marking the grave of the County Sheriff Deputy Bateman who is buried at CC. The stone now stands out, and resulted in a request that other gravestones be similarly “cleaned.” Leslie is opposed, based on her research that cleaning cemetery headstones is a delicate task, and that certain cleaning techniques can damage the stones.

From an historical preservation perspective, cleaning can alter headstones. Vestry discussed possible responses to this request, and how to protect our historic cemetery from this and other well intended, but potentially damaging actions to the property (e.g. artificial decorations and plastic which damage mowers and do not biodegrade). It was agreed that a reminder of cemetery guidelines be published in the Chimes.

Rock Spring Keepers: RSK netted \$345 from the raffle basket. Road clean up is going well. The property overall looks good. The shed is being used. The NexTrex Challenge II begins in June. The nasty knotweed has returned, and is defying containment efforts. RSK is considering purchase of a “Pullerbear” device for removing underground weeds and small stumps,. The vigorous removal campaign includes mowing, use of tarps to eliminate sunlight and kill roots, pulling out roots by hand or with Pullerbear tool, and re-applying defoliant to stems in the fall, followed by planting grass or other ground cover.

Other noteworthy items:

In absence of Sr. Warden, it was noted that Jazzercise will not be meeting the week before the June 17th rummage sale, but they have asked to meet Saturday June 24th, which is agreeable to Vestry.

After a closing prayer for the Sacred Earth, the meeting adjourned at 8:10 pm. The next Vestry meeting will be on Wednesday, June 21st.

ROCK SPRING CEMETERY
AT CHRIST CHURCH

POLICY AND PROCEDURES

The Rock Spring Cemetery was established in 1795 and has been a landmark in Forest Hill for more than two centuries. It is part of Forest Hill's identity and the resting place for many of Harford County's prominent citizens. The Cemetery's presence helps to provide a sense of peace to passersby and residents of the community.

Therefore, it is incumbent upon Christ Church members to preserve and protect the historic and aesthetic character of Rock Spring Cemetery, which is worthy and deserving of our respect and continued vigilance.

Policy:

The members of Christ Church intend to maintain the original character of the Cemetery as it exists in its current state as it has evolved over the last two hundred years. Therefore, all work in the Cemetery must have prior approval of the Cemetery Administrator and/or the Vestry.

From an ethical point of view, the Guiding Philosophy is to:

- Be respectful.
- Be safe.
- Be authentic.
- Do no harm.
- Conserve original materials.

Master Plan:

Create a map of the Cemetery.

Accurately record descriptions of monuments and markers including names, dates, inscriptions, location, orientation, size, insignia/symbols, and condition.

Restore and repair fallen markers.

Maintenance Plan:

1. Regularly mow and trim the grass.
2. Enforce compliance with regulations regarding grave site decorations.
3. Leave headstones as time and nature have provided, with the exception of removing lichen or moss with a mist spray of water and a soft bristle brush or soft natural sponge.

As with antique furniture and coins, the patina that has developed over the centuries should not be disturbed. Therefore, the cleaning of grave markers with chemicals, soap, detergents, ammonia, bleach, vinegar, or any substance other than

a fine spray of pure water is prohibited, as is the use of abrasive brushes or scrapers. Power washing is strictly prohibited.

4. Lift and reset fallen headstones.

Emergency Preparedness:

1. Put personal safety first.
2. Have contact information readily available.
3. Document the full extent of damage.
4. Undertake cleaning and repair.

Cemetery Etiquette:

Behavior befitting this hallowed and sacred ground is required.

No trespassing from dusk until dawn.

No loud voices.

No loitering.

No food and drink.

No pets.

No digging or planting of any kind.

No artificial flowers between April 1 and October 30. Real cut flowers only except in November through March.

No decorations other than the above (including but not limited to) glass, ceramic, plastic, Styrofoam, toys, balloons, pinwheels, plush animals, solar lights, bird feeders, etc. Prohibited decorations will be removed and discarded.

No rubbing of grave stones.

No cleaning of grave markers except as previously described.

Complete Rock Spring Cemetery Rules and Regulations are available in the Church office.

Responsibility:

Application of the Policy and Procedures is the responsibility of the Cemetery Administrator, the Vestry, and members of Christ Church.

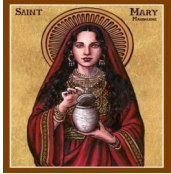
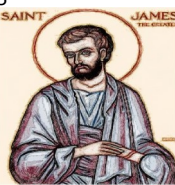
